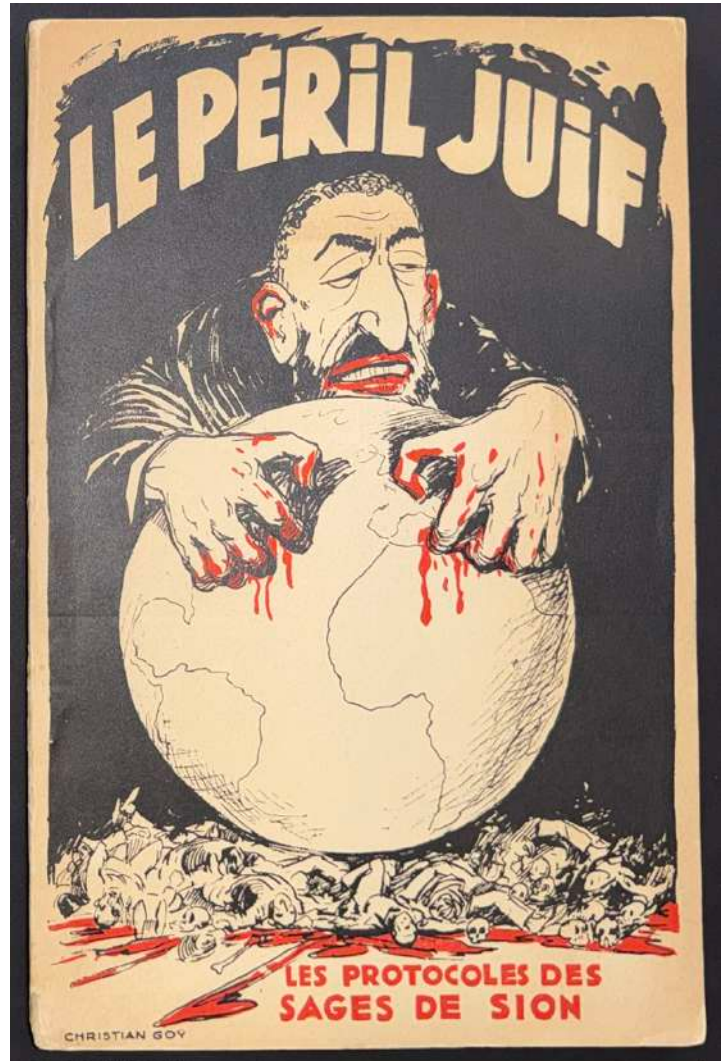

The Legacy of the “Protocols”

Purporting to represent the secret records of a meeting held on the sidelines of the First Zionist Congress in 1897 in Basel, the Protocols of the Learned Elders of Zion were drafted by the Russian mystic Sergei Nilus (borrowing liberally from earlier sources) and first published in Russia in 1905. The Protocols list instructions that were supposedly delivered to leading figures of world Jewry, marking the deliberations of a global Jewish conspiracy that was never intended to reach the eyes of simple-minded Gentiles. When first published, the Protocols did not have a major impact. It was the profoundly dislocating experience of the first World War, the Bolshevik Revolution, the subsequent search for scapegoats, and a fever swamp of hatreds and conspiracy theories, that created space for a sudden explosion of translations soon after the war.

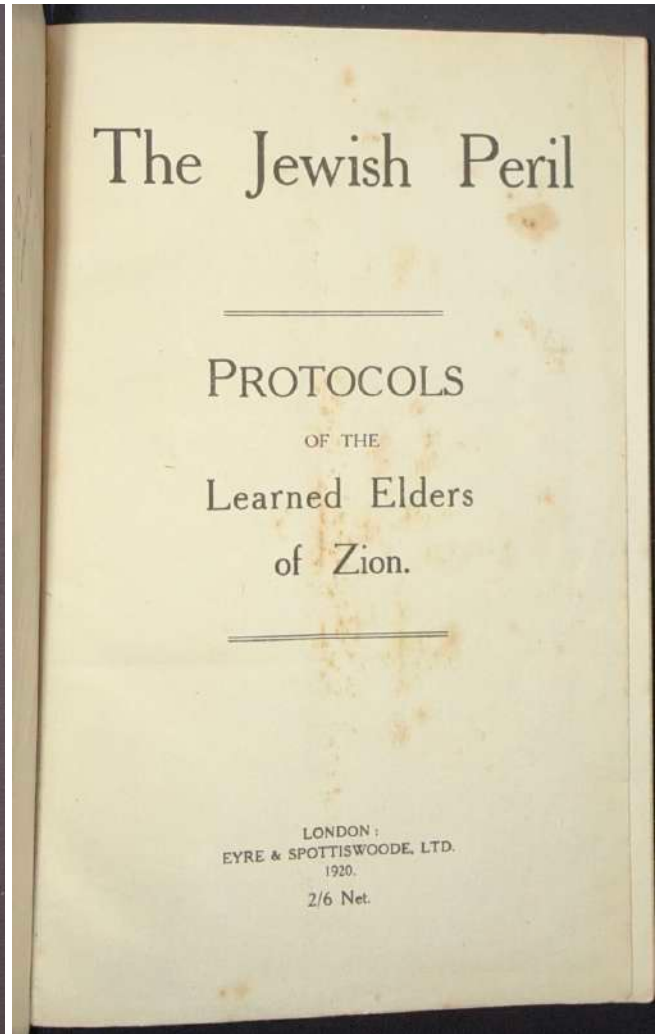
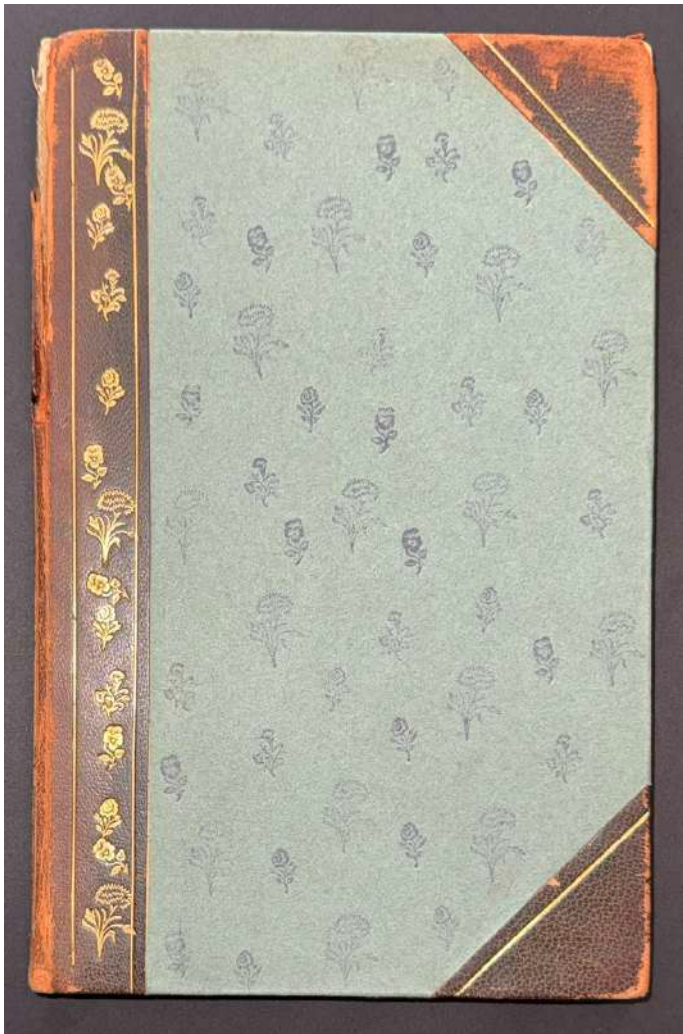
In the words of Goran Larsson, author of the final item in this list, "In light of the fact that this vicious publication has caused more suffering on the Jewish people in the last century than any other single document, I regard it necessary that people today should know about it - its content, history and bitter fruits." This catalog represents a broad sample of editions in European languages, from the immediate post-war period into the 1970s. It also includes other works responding directly to or vouching for the authenticity of the Protocols. In an era in which the internet has re-kindled these conspiracy theories first put forward more than a century ago, adjusting them to modern contexts and putting them on the screens of credulous audiences around the world, we feel it is important to trace the history and devastating impact of this book. The same strategies it uses have been deployed in countless times and places since. These psychological tools appear in contemporary attacks not only on Jews but on more recent immigrants, such as Muslims, with “Sharia Law” becoming a new bogeyman, depicted as a supposed strategy for conquest.

Items are divided by language, and then listed in chronological order within each section. A handful of refutations of the text conclude the list.



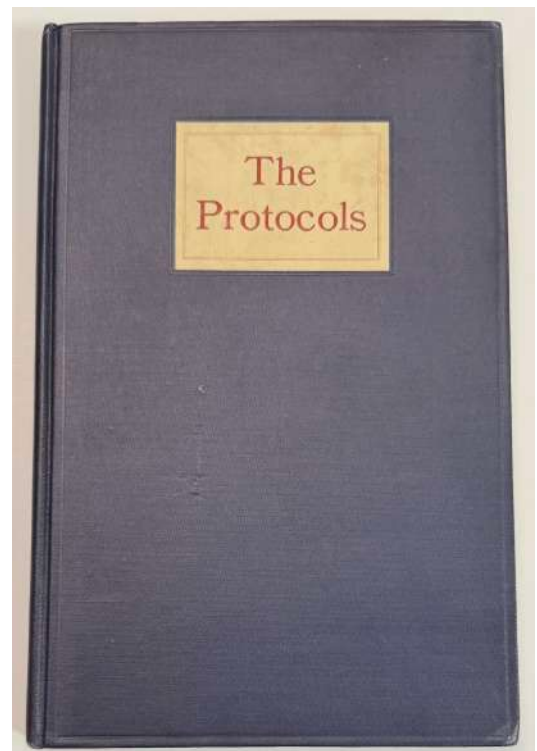

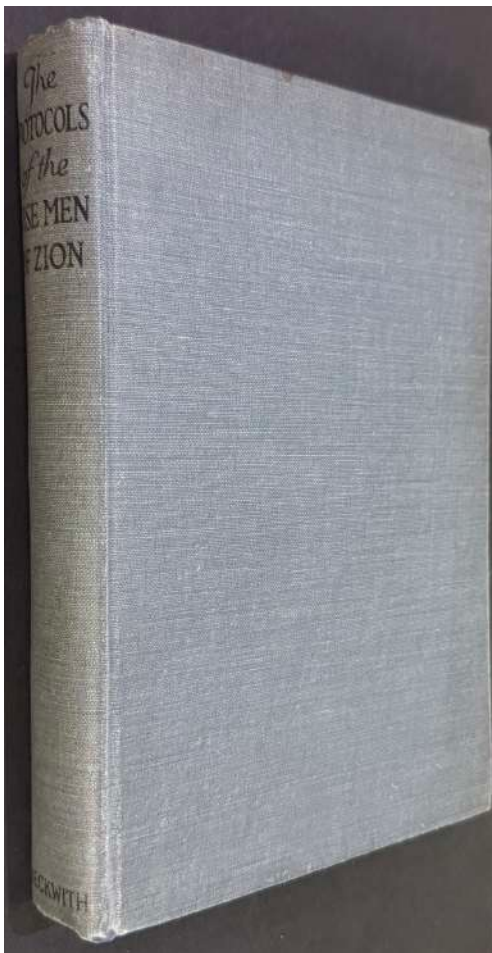

Brasol, who is believed to have been responsible for bringing this edition to press, was a White Russian exile who urged the re-establishment of the Russian monarchy and blamed Jews for the Bolshevik Revolution. He later boasted that his books "have done the Jews more injury than would have been done to them by ten pogroms."



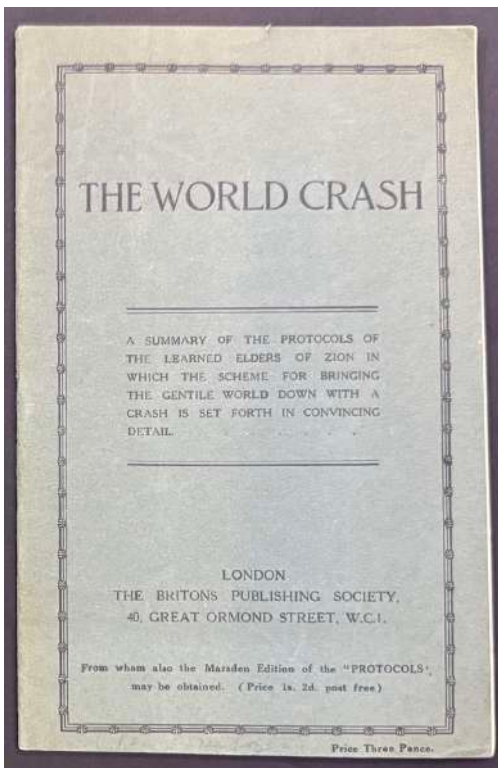
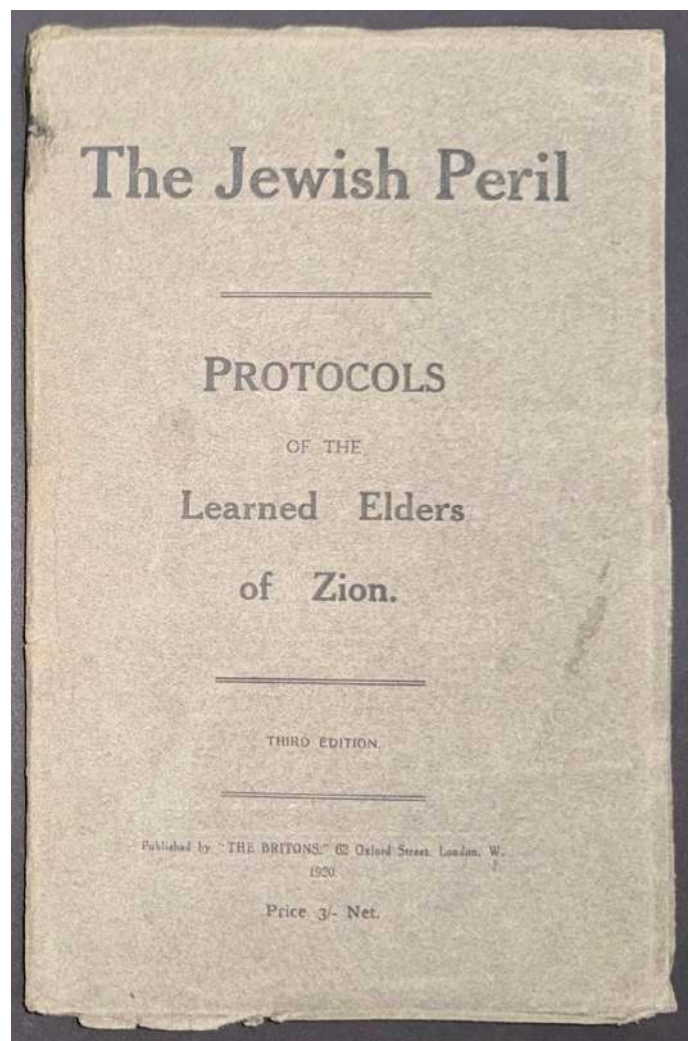

Fleischhauer, a prominent publisher of anti-Semitic and anti-Masonic works, argued that they were genuine, presenting the testimony contained herein to the court.
